Focus of Development: to raise the profile of PE, participation and increase the entitlement of high quality PE for all pupils both within and beyond the school curriculum.

Physical Education Leader: William Leach

Brief outline and aims:

As part of the school focus children were consulted in terms of their desires for an improved PE curriculum. It was noted through discussions with pupils and the sports leaders that they sometimes felt overwhelmed in competitive team sport activities where pupils' skills out matched theirs. In terms of after school pupils requested a wider range of sporting activity e.g. 'sports that they haven't had the opportunity to before'. Children also wanted to have more opportunities to be active during breaks, lunch and after school clubs. Once we had identified the priorities for pupils these were matched with schools focus for development. Success criteria was considered for each priority and how change could be implemented at whole school level to lead to the improvement of high quality teaching and learning within the PE curriculum overall.

Participation

One of the key areas identified this year for development was participation. With the playground being highlighted by the Pupil Voice it was decided alongside Sports Leaders and School Council members how the playground could be improved. Alongside this alternative afterschool clubs have been made available to increase the amount of people taking part.
